Allon is a director and founding partner of OCL Vision. He is an elected council member for both the UKISCRS and the BSRS. He has been a Consultant since 2012 specialising in laser refractive surgery, cataract surgery with advanced technology lenses and corneal surgery. He has published over 45 peer-reviewed scientific papers, 16 book chapters and he is the co-author of a comprehensive textbook of Ophthalmology, which is now in its third edition. He is a key opinion leader for the Ophthalmic Industry and is regularly invited to chair events and lecture both nationally & internationally. Allon was the first surgeon in the UK and one of the first in the world to carry out Smartsight KLex laser vision correction.

She is currently Secretary Elect to UKISCRS.



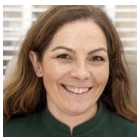
Prof. Johnny Moore

Dr. Johnny Moore (N Ireland) is a Consultant Ophthalmic Surgeon and Clinical Director of Cathedral Eye Clinic, specialising in ocular surface reconstruction, laser and lens based refractive surgery, cataract and other intra-ocular eye surgery.

He currently works at Cathedral Eye Clinic where he is a busy anterior segment and refractive surgeon. He has published more than 100 peer reviewed articles, one book and several book chapters. His current research interests include: Development of robotic eye surgery Development of artificial intelligence for prediction of cataract success through improved biometry and other outcomes.

His research partners in these topics include: Queens University Belfast, Ulster University, Aston University. He was involved in the development of the online PGDip/MSc Cataract and Refractive Surgery course through the University of Ulster as previous visiting professor. This course was designed to train surgeons, optometrists, laser technicians and others involved in this area from around the world in the intricacies of laser and refractive cataract surgery.

He is currently Associate Editor of the Journal of Cataract and Refractive Surgery (JCRS) Online Case Reports. He is currently an Honorary Professor in the College of Health and Life Science Aston University 2021-2026. He is a visiting Professor at Tianjin Medical University Eye Hospital in Tianjin, China and is involved in working with charities such as Khmer Sight Foundation Cambodia and the Christian Blind Mission in Zimbabwe.



Ms. Laura Crawley

Laura Crawley is a Consultant Ophthalmic Surgeon at Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust with specialist interests in Glaucoma and Cataracts. She was Clinical Director for ophthalmology and more recently Strategy lead for Ophthalmology in North West London. She is treasurer elect for UKISCRS. She qualified in medicine from University of Bristol in 1999, winning the Gold medal and Suple prizes for medicine and surgery.

Having completed physician training in Bristol she undertook Ophthalmology training in Oxford and then in London at Moorfields and Imperial. She won the national Alcon Glaucoma prize in 2009 and holds the Royal College of Ophthalmologists' Treacher Collins Prize 2012 and West London Ophthalmic Research Medal 2011.

She is an Honorary Senior Lecturer at Imperial College London. Her research is focused on topical glaucoma treatments and their effects on the ocular surface, micro invasive glaucoma surgery in glaucoma management and developing strategies for managing chronic eye conditions in community diagnostics hubs to improve the variation in rates of registerable blindness across communities.



Mr. Mario John Saldanha

Mr. Saldanha is a Consultant Ophthalmologist with subspecialist interest in Cornea, Cataract and refractive surgery. His interest in cornea was fueled towards the completion of the training program at the John Radcliffe Hospital, Oxford and the University Hospital of Wales. Mr. Saldanha is Fellow of the Royal College of Ophthalmologists, (London, United Kingdom) and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow (Glasgow, United Kingdom). He has also achieved the Laser Refractive Surgery Certificate from the Royal College of Ophthalmologists.

In 2013 he was awarded the Ethicon Foundation Travelling Scholarship Award from the Royal College of Ophthalmologists to assist him in pursuing his subspecialty fellowship in Corneal, Refractive Surgery and External Diseases in North America at the Toronto Western Hospital under the professional guidance of Dr. Rootman, Dr. Slomovic and Dr. Chan.

Mr. Saldanha is passionate about Lamellar Keratoplasty (DMEK) and Cross-linking and has set-up these services as the only center in South Wales that is offering them. He strives to give his patients the best outcomes and believes that, "By listening and paying attention to my patients' needs I understand their expectations. This helps me plan and advise the best treatment for them."

Mr. Saldanha is Lead for Cornea services in Swansea and West Wales. He represents Wales at the UKISCRS and the BSRS societies and is invited faculty for the DMEK courses at the ASCRS and ESCRS.

He is also Director of SANA, which is the only multispecialty Private Eye Hospital in Wales.

In his spare time, he loves watching movies, playing tennis, the outdoors and spending time with his family.



Ms. Seema Anand

Consultant Ophthalmologist, Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust.

Seema Anand specialises in complex external eye disease, cornea and refractive surgery. She was appointed as a Consultant Ophthalmologist at South Tees NHS Trust in 2009. She moved to her current post at St James's University Hospital Leeds in 2015, where she is the Lead Clinician for Ophthalmology and the Lead for Cornea and Refractive surgery.

She did her primary ophthalmology training in London and West Midlands followed by higher surgical training in West Yorkshire. She undertook advanced subspecialty training in cornea and refractive surgery at Flinders Medical Centre in Adelaide, Australia and Moorfields Eye Hospital in London. Her professional activities include an NHS practice providing tertiary referral service for complex external eye disease, corneal and refractive surgery and private practice specialising in laser and lens-based refractive surgery. Her areas of special interest include keratoconus and complex corneal transplantation. She has over 50 presentations and publications spanning the field of cornea and external eye disease.

Tom Flynn is a Consultant Ophthalmologist at Bon Secours Hospital, Cork with a specialist practice in Cornea, Cataract and Refractive surgery. He previously worked as a Consultant Ophthalmologist at Moorfields Eye Hospital, London in the Cornea, Cataract and Refractive Surgery departments. His research interests include corneal imaging, corneal transplantation and cataract surgery outcomes and he was awarded a PhD by University College London for his research on corneal transplant immunology.

Annegret Dahlmann-Noor is a consultant in children's eye health at Moorfields Eye Hospital in London. She also has an active research portfolio, leading clinical trials of new myopia treatments for children and working with colleagues across University College London to understand why and how the eye changes in myopia, and how to slow that process down.

She was awarded a PhD with honours for her thesis on corneal wound healing and the use of mitomycin C in laser eye surgery. She is the clinical lead for the graft database and the Moorfields Eye Bank, and has been awarded a Clinical Excellence Award in recognition for her work in developing a system to track the outcomes of corneal transplant surgery.

Mr. Mandal MBChB FEBO FRCOphth PGDip FWCERS is an experienced ophthalmic surgeon specialising in refractive lens and laser, corneal transplant, and cataract surgery. He earned his medical degree from the University of Birmingham during which time he completed a research elective at Bascom Palmer Eye Institute in Miami. He then completed a seven-year residency at the London School of Ophthalmology. Mr. Mandal has extensive experience from Moorfields Eye Hospital where he completed two fellowships in Cornea and Cataract Surgery. He then carried out a refractive fellowship on Harley Street and went on to carry out a fourth fellowship in Vancouver in the area of complex corneal transplantation and topography guided PRK. He has performed over 2000 LASIK, PRK and SMILE surgeries and 3000 refractive lens exchange surgeries. He also has specialist practice privileges in Canada and has participated in missions with the Khmer Sight Foundation in Cambodia. Most recently he was awarded Fellow of the World College of Refractive Surgeons.



Ms. Nardine Menassa

Miss Nardine Menassa is a Consultant Ophthalmic Surgeon at St. Paul's Eye Unit at the Royal Liverpool University Hospital with a Special Interest in Cornea, Cataract and Ocular Surface Disease. She completed her undergraduate training at the University of Heidelberg, Germany, where she was also awarded Medical Doctor (MD) doctorate with great honours for her research thesis on developing a PCR based tool for the rapid diagnosis of fungal keratitis.

Miss Menassa trained in Ophthalmology in Heidelberg, Germany, Lucerne, Switzerland and Leicester, UK and awarded the Fellowship of the Royal College of Ophthalmologists and the Certificate of Completion of Training. She accomplished her TSC fellowship at the University Hospitals of Leicester and a post-CCT fellowship at the Royal Liverpool University Hospital, both in corneal and ocular surface diseases.

As an Honorary Senior Clinical Lecturer at the University of Liverpool she collaborates closely with a scientific team to develop a corneal epithelial cell bandage, a project awarded £2.1 million by the MRC. Miss Menassa is the lead for cataract services at Liverpool University Hospitals and is the Regional Representative to Council at the Royal College of Ophthalmologists. She also represents the Northwest of England at the Ocular Tissue Advisory Group and is an Examiner at the Royal College of Ophthalmologists.



Prof. Philip Bloom

Philip Bloom is Consultant Ophthalmologist at the Western Eye Hospital (Imperial), specialising in complex Glaucoma & Cataract. Qualifying in 1984 (Bristol University), he trained in Bristol, Moorfields and the Western Eye Hospital.

He is a Keeler Scholarship Trustee (RCOphth) and Trustee of UKISCRS (UK & Ireland Society of Cataract & Refractive Surgeons). He is past Chairman of Glaucoma UK (2017-22, and past President of UKISCRS (2018-20). He has been Trustee / Board Member of the Royal Society of Medicine (RSM, 2017-21) and past President of the RSM Ophthalmology Section (2012-14). He is course leader for Plymouth University's Post-Graduate Diploma in Ophthalmology.

He was awarded the RCS(Edinburgh) Muthusamy Gold Medal (1990) and the RCOphth Keeler Scholarship (1994-5). He was made a Distinguished Fellow in Glaucoma Surgery (FGS) in the Founding FGS class (2020) of the International Society of Glaucoma Surgery (ISGS). He became a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons in 2021.

Research interests include minimally invasive glaucoma surgery (including cyclophotocoagulation), neuroprotection, surgical simulation/training, and spectacle independence after cataract surgery.

He adores film & all forms of music, dabbles in photography and singing, is married to a General Practitioner and has 2 children but prefers dogs.



Prof. Paul Ursell

Prof Ursell is an NHS Consultant at Epsom & St Helier University NHS Trust appointed in 2001, Honorary Professor University of Bradford School of Optometry & Visual Science and Honorary Senior Lecturer at the Institute of Biomedical Education, St Georges Hospital Medical School, London. He runs specialist clinics covering corneal disease and advanced cataract surgery.

Originally trained in both cornea and neuro-ophthalmology, Simon worked as a hospital consultant and in private practice for almost twenty years: for the last ten years, however, he has been medical director for Evolutio Care Innovations. 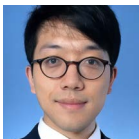
Mr. William Moore

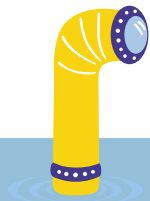

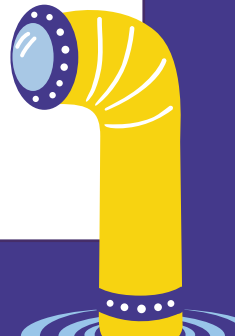

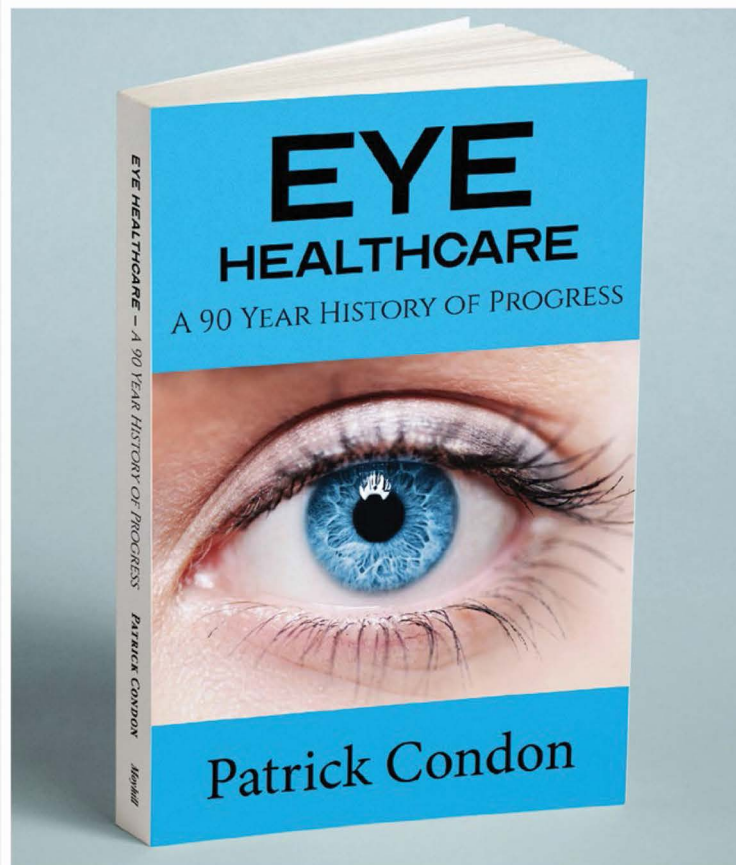
